**Lometa Regional Water System (Lampasas County)**

<b>Service</b>	Retail water treatment and distribution
<b>Customers</b>	Residents of a 440-square-mile area that includes Lometa and portions of Lampasas, San Saba, Mills and Burnet counties
<b>Facilities</b>	Treatment plant and distribution system Interconnection with City of Lampasas water system
<b>Estimated Population Served</b>	2,320
<b>System Performance</b>	System capacity: 1.0 mgd Peak daily flow (12 month): 700,000 gpd

**Background** LCRA acquired the Lometa Regional Water System from the City of Lometa and from the Lometa Rural Water Supply Corporation in 1999. Initially, water was provided using existing facilities, with water transported from Stillhouse Hollow Lake via several entities. To make more water available, LCRA constructed a raw water intake from the Colorado River, a transmission main from the river to a new small reservoir, and a new treatment plant northwest of Lometa.
