Community Development Partnership Program Scoring Criteria

1. <u>Funding category</u>: SB 219 delineates specific areas eligible for funding. Projects receive points based on the program area and the impact they will have on communities in our wholesale power or water service areas. Projects meeting the following criteria will receive additional points:

Volunteer fire department; Public safety life-saving equipment; Public education, demonstration component; Organization or project affected by a natural disaster.

- 2. <u>Applicant's contribution/match</u>: Applicants that contribute more than the required minimum match receive higher scores. Applicants requesting more than \$5,000 and not meeting the minimum 20 percent matching funds requirement are not eligible.
- 3. <u>Project impact</u>: Projects impacting more people receive higher scores.
- 4. <u>Project completion</u>: If the grant funds enable the applicant to complete the project the applicant receives additional points. If not, applicant loses points.
- 5. <u>Recent CDPP grant</u>: Applicants that have received a CDPP grant within five years lose points.
- 6. <u>Applicant's contribution and impact</u>: Applicants receive points based on the match contribution and number of people impacted by the project.
- 7. <u>Impact on natural resources</u>: Projects that have a positive impact on natural resources by addressing issues such as energy or water conservation.
- 8. <u>LCRA wholesale electric customer</u>: Applicants receive additional points if their electric provider is an LCRA 2041 customer abiding by the terms and conditions of their wholesale power contract.
- **9.** <u>Population</u>: Points are awarded to smaller, rural communities with fewer resources than those available in larger communities. The largest cities lose points.*
- **10.** <u>Poverty level</u>: Projects in areas where the percentage of persons below poverty is higher than the state level percentage receive additional points.*
- **11.** <u>Per capita income</u>: Projects in areas where per capita income falls below the state level receive additional points.*
