The North McCamey Station is located approximately 0.6 mile north of the city of McCamey and northwest of the intersection of United States Highway (US) 67 and US 385, and the Sand Lake Station is located approximately 6 miles northeast of the city of Pecos on the northwest side of Farm-to-Market Road (FM) 3398. The estimated cost range of this project is \$335,863,000 to \$414,878,000.

It is important for an affected person to intervene because the utility is not obligated to keep affected persons informed of the PUC's proceedings and cannot predict which route may or may not be approved by the PUC.

The deadline for intervention in the docket is **August 7**, **2023**, and the PUC should receive a letter from you requesting intervention by that date.
